Ivy joins DCD from the Collegiate School, a K-12 boys' school in Manhattan, where she served as Grade 6 Dean and English faculty member. She brings a longstanding commitment and passion for DEI work, and during her time at Collegiate, she founded and facilitated the Faculty and Staff of Color Affinity Group, co-facilitated the school's affinity space for students of color, and served on Collegiate's Affinity Council. As a leader in these groups, Ivy has worked to enhance the hiring and recruitment practices at Collegiate, led professional development groups for her white colleagues, and used survey feedback to engage senior administrators in discussions around retention, accountability measures, and organizational structures. A contributing author to *Teaching Brilliant and Beautiful Black Girls*, Ivy has presented at several conferences including the People of Color Conference and NYSAIS Diversity Conference. She's been awarded grants for curriculum development, research, and for writing a comprehensive anti-bias curriculum for students in grades 5 and 6.

Ivy earned her undergraduate degree in Africana Studies at Brown University and a Master's in Teaching of English at Teachers College.

Active outside of the Collegiate community, Ivy serves as communications co-chair with the People of Color in Independent Schools, NY, and remains an active Brown alumna, serving as treasurer on her class board. Catherine's career began in the classroom, teaching in varied settings worldwide including preschool in Texas, lower school English in Finland, and 4th grade locally at St. Stephen's Elementary School in Watertown. At Nashoba Brooks School in Concord she served as the Librarian and Transliteracy Integration Specialist and collaborated with PK - grade 8 teachers to integrate library, technology, and literacy skills into their curricula, taught lessons, and managed parent volunteers. She went on to serve as Elementary Librarian at Seoul International School where she redesigned the library, significantly increased circulation, and implemented a drive-thru library circulation system during COVID.

His love of writing was bolstered during his previous positions as editor-in-chief at *Santa Ana River Review* and journalist with the California Student Sustainability Coalition.

This organization’s goal is to produce creative media to tell the stories of the world’s most endangered species and threatened ecosystems and to teach the next generation of creative environmental storytellers to do the same. Letter from Charles Rudnick, Director of Advancement



To Members of the DCD Community,

As we embark on a third school year impacted by a pandemic many initially thought would last a matter of weeks, the DCD experience is both instructive and inspirational.

When the 2020-2021 school year opened, we were in uncharted territory. While the faculty, staff, and administration had worked feverishly through the summer of 2020 creating reopening and contingency plans, nobody really knew what was going to happen when all those “Hawks” returned to Sandy Valley Road in September. After all, there was no playbook for opening a school in a pandemic.

As you will see from the statistics in these pages, DCD came through with flying colors. While we had a few instances requiring pods to quarantine, there was not a single case of in-school transmission during the entire academic year. As a result, we were able to provide a full-time in-person learning experience for the entire year — a remarkable feat with enormous developmental and social-emotional benefits for our students.

How was this possible? In a word, *community*. From our students, who have demonstrated repeatedly that they can and will adapt to whatever version of DCD is thrown at them; to our faculty, who have

been remarkable in their ability to pivot and create meaningful opportunities to grow and learn in shifting configurations; to our parents, who have been willing to prioritize the safety of our community in their personal decisions and to flex with the constellation of new requirements, we came together to make sure DCD not only survived but thrived.

This strong commitment to DCD’s health also manifested itself in our philanthropy. As this Annual Report of Giving demonstrates, there was an outpouring of support for the school not only from our current parents, but from alumni, grandparents, past parents, friends, and faculty. Our Annual Fund exceeded its financial goal and reached 100% participation by current parents, faculty/staff (for the 11th year in a row!), and trustees, while we also saw robust giving to the Eighth Grade Gift Fund, Spring Brick fundraiser, and capital campaign — which remains on target for our goal to rebuild DCD’s core gathering spaces and strengthen our endowment.

These outcomes have provided critical resources to helping DCD navigate the pandemic and reflect a belief in DCD’s efforts to remain true to its mission, even in the midst of these enormously challenging times. On behalf of all of us at DCD, thank you for your trust in DCD and for your generosity.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

Making a charitable gift is a very personal decision. Understanding the differences between gifts to the Annual Fund and gifts to the Endowment will help you determine the impact you want to have on the people and spaces at DCD that are most important to you.

DCD needs annual fund gifts *and* endowed gifts to support its mission now and in the future. Determining the impact you hope to have may lead you toward one gift type versus another.

Annual Fund gifts have a direct and immediate impact on all aspects of DCD and support academics, athletics, arts, financial aid, facilities and campus life. It is not usually invested for the long term but will be used to meet a pressing priority, possibly in the same fiscal year that DCD receives it. Additionally, the Annual Fund provides the flexibility to respond quickly to new opportunities and unexpected needs.

Endowed gifts are a permanent, self-sustaining source of funding. Each year, a portion of the value of the fund is paid out to support the fund's purpose, and any earnings in excess of this distribution are used to build the fund's market value. An endowed fund can grow and provide support for its designated purpose in perpetuity. When you give to an endowment fund that already exists, you create a permanent legacy of support for DCD.
