INSPIRES students to become caring, ethical members of the larger world by emphasizing thoughtful citizenship and respect for self and others.

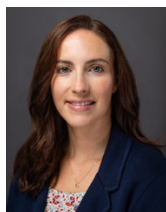
Welcome New Faculty and Staff 2023-2024

Dear Members of the DCD Community,



DCD in 2022-23 remained steadfast in its commitment to creating a stable, inclusive, and intellectually challenging environment for our students to learn and grow – and to place the broader world in an appropriate perspective.

With strong enrollment, steadily increasing diversity in our student and faculty populations, and a vibrant academic program fueled by thoughtful program reviews and new ideas incubated by our Head's Innovation Fund, DCD is thriving and fostering a strong sense of belonging.

None of this would be possible without the incredible generosity of you, our donors. With gifts of all sizes, you demonstrated support for DCD's mission and the incredible faculty and staff who bring it to life every day for our students, and set a number of new milestones in the process:

- ▶ DCD's Annual Fund crossed the \$700,000 threshold for the first time, raising more in support of our annual operating expenses than ever before and reaching 96% current parent participation;
- ▶ DCD's first-ever Giving Day raised more than \$80,000, including matching gifts, from 200 donors during the Olympics;

- ▶ DCD's faculty and staff reached 100% participation in the Annual Fund for the 13th straight year, demonstrating incredible support for the school; and
- ▶ DCD's Together Capital Campaign reached \$12.5 million during the "quiet phase" through June, showing wide and deep enthusiasm for the school's strategic vision of improving our gathering spaces, and laying a strong foundation for the public phase which officially launched this fall.

These data points are just a snapshot of the many ways in which the DCD community impacted the school through philanthropy last year (another is through the 8th Grade Parent Gift, described in detail in this report, which refurbished the legacy school bell and strengthened our endowment). Whether it's through visible markers such as these, or the quiet ways in which parents and others donate time and energy, our school is a better place because of your willingness to give back.

On behalf of everyone at DCD, thank you for your support and for being such an important part of the DCD family.

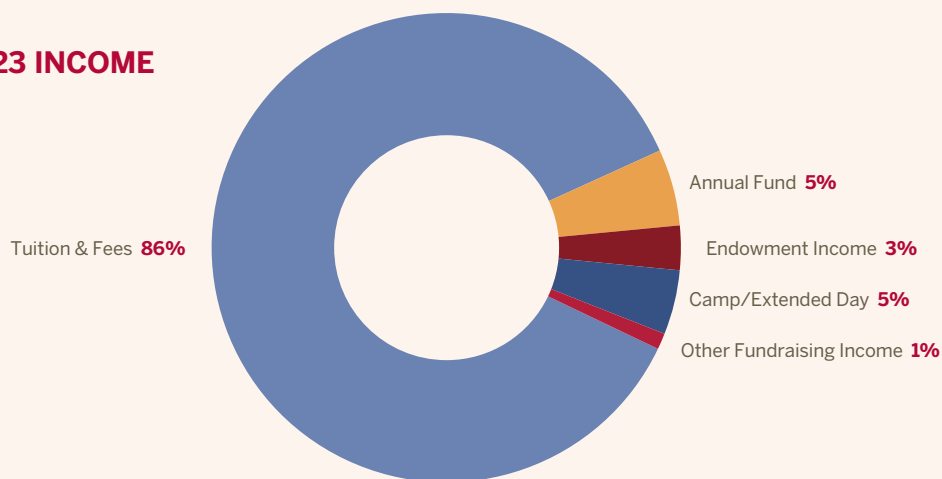

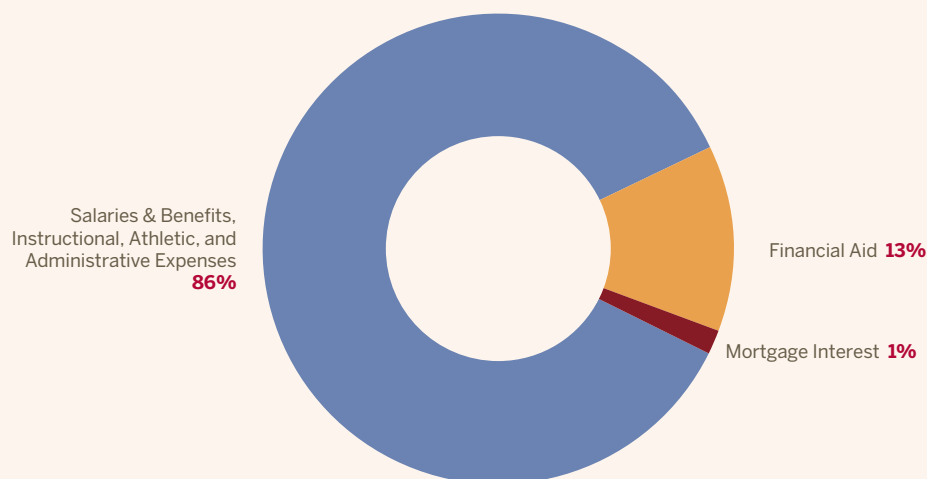

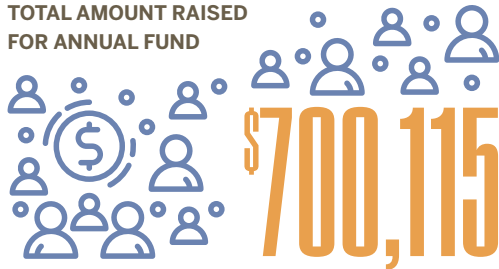

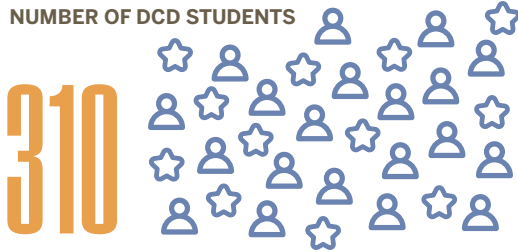

NUMBER OF DCD STUDENTS



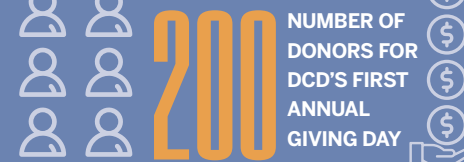
